

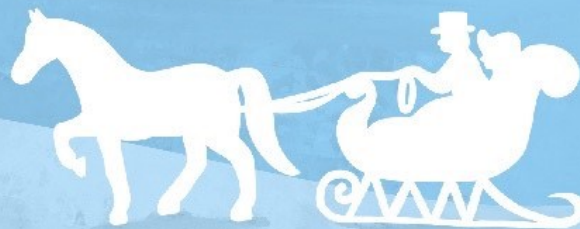
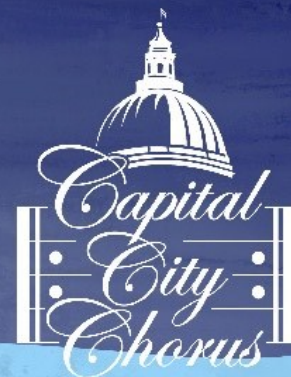
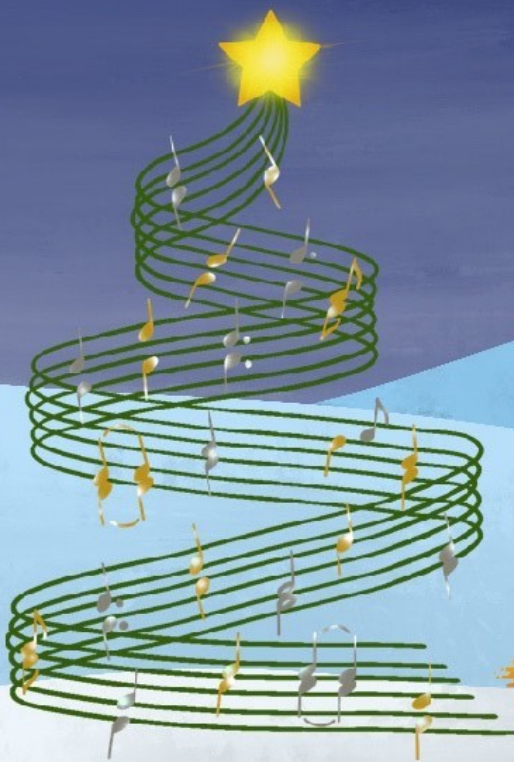

Dan also maintains a studio of private voice and organ students. He founded the CCC in the fall of 2018. Previously, he was the Assistant Director of the Olympia Choral Society for six years. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ, and a Master's degree in Music from Concordia University Wisconsin in Mequon, WI. Dan hopes that as a church musician and music educator, he can continue to spread his appreciation and knowledge of music to others.

She has also served on the faculties of Kean University; Montclair State University; Hamilton College; Muskingum College; Stephens College; the State University of New York; and South Puget Sound Community College.
